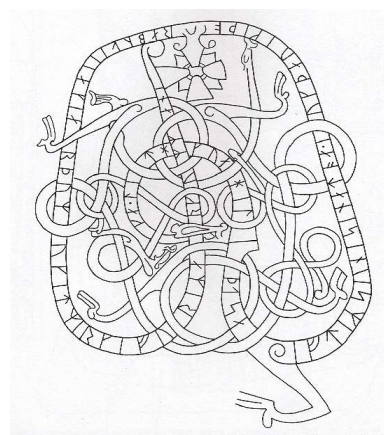
I remind all canton heralds that their 1st quarter report, covering January through March, is due before the end of April to myself and Lord Eogan. Heralds at large need only do the annual report.

Minutes from the Baronial Meeting that took place on March 20th, 2005

Canton Reports

Elvegast - Adriana requested Seneschals reports to be first - she went first. She talked about the Summer Reading Program (of the public libraries) - it's "Dragons and Daring Deeds". The head kids librarian of the Wake County Library wants a list of people to call for library demos - want people who can provide particular types of demos. A topic list was passed around for signups. Discussion was held regarding library demos around the Barony - Wake County in particular will be complicated due to the number of branches with different age groups. The outcome is that each group's seneschal will be the point of contact for each county's library. Elvegast will also be having an armor

repair workshop on Wednesday evening - Calli's house at 6 o'clock. Meetings remain on Thursday night. Renn Faire demo is coming up, need artisans for the 2nd weekend. Talk to Adriana or to Gaston/Rosalind if interested.

Attilium - meetings 1st and 3rd weeks of month at Barnes and Nobles - fighter practices on Sundays. Need help with dogwood festival demo - 22nd of April, 7-9 - will have most of library - fighters and artisans needed. Also, the Girl Scout Council is having a Jamboree - 13th-15th of May - looking for artisans to teach classes / living history display... A&S on Saturday morning, fighting on Saturday night. Feast that evening (free). May result in a new site for the Barony (Camp Mary Atkins, north of Fayetteville).

Buckston - Buckston meets on Tues - fighter practice at 5, meeting at 7:30-9:00. Will need assistance for Library demos - Fighters esp. for May 21, dance on June 8 (evening). Eno festival is upcoming as well (July 2-4). Midsummer's Twilight Tourney June 18 - "dinner" fundraiser slot available due to "backwards" event. (Feast is around lunchtime).

Kappellenburg - still meets on Monday nights. Will be picking new round of classes soon. We are also starting a dance night once per month - probably on the 3rd Monday of the month.

Nimenefeld - Casting class Monday the 20th at Idonea's. Nimenefeld will be holding a bake sale at ToC - breakfast/dessert, to raise money for the Baron's tabard fund. Meetings are one Tues. per month.

Eagle's Landing - tentative plans for a revel in April - more details to come later, but would like everyone to come down and say hi.

Officer Reports

"Virtual Baroness's report": Gulf Wars was very wet - it dried out, they packed, then it started raining again. Evening court 8pm Friday - Tournament of Chivalry. Benches and Eric need to be painted before ToC. Weapon of the Month club to be at Buckston - Glaive. Pennsic - if you are camping with the barony, 100sq ft per person will revert to the barony - if you need more space, buy it. If you don't register with both Cooper's AND the Barony, you will not be staying with the Barony. \$15 camp fee per person. Chow and Maddalena will be camp stewards again. The Barony will NOT be renting from Grimm's this year.

Chirurgeon - no report from Galen. Andreas talked to Ceridwen, there will be Chirurgeonate at ToC.

Herald - Danr - 2 cantons have heraldry in process. Eogan gave a court report from KASF.

Rapier / Heavy Marshalls were not present. Watch the Keep for info on Baronial fighter practice - next practice is supposed to be at Carolina Pines, but it is the same weekend as ToC.

Quartermaster - Idonea - Their Excell. have asked Idonea to overhaul gear. Idonea wishes to have a cook's meeting to overhaul feast gear and upgrade gear - time and place will be posted on the Keep. The Rolling Pin is having a going out of business sale, as a side note. Baronial shed - check will be written for \$1200 for 13 months. If you have Baronial stuff, please give to Idonea.

Seneschal - Attended the Optimist Club board meeting for information on site. Meeting was very positive. The OC would like to coordinate with us for upgrades - would like suggestions as they are planning improvements (please send these to Steve). If we help with their improvements, may

discount in future. The OC has had decreased reservations lately, so they're very concerned with what people want. They are also planning to have a "medieval fair" for kids with cancer (and families) from the local medical centers, at the beach – 1st weekend of May – may want help – Steve is coordinating, and this may be extended to future medieval weekends at the Farm. Discussion ensued of best use of the land/buildings/etc.

Old Business

UNC-TV – tonight – 6pm – have to have 20 people there for airtime. Still need 4 people.

Scriptorium – April 10th – Café Feed Me (last time). Noon-??
Glass Workers in April – TBD.

New Business

There will be a silent auction at ToC for the Royal Travel Fund – if you'd like to donate items, contact Ceridwen or Dunstan.

Camp Kanata's pricing is being raised to \$2000, as opposed to \$1450 as it was last year (the per day rate is going up). The deposit for Ymir has been put in place.

Baronial meeting will be at Optimist Farm – April 17th – Noon. Directions are posted elsewhere in this newsletter.

Elsbeth is still looking for info for the new Baronial phone list.

The Baronial Meeting was adjourned. Here ends the minutes.

Midsummers Twilight Tourney at Buckston-on-Eno is scheduled for June 18th.



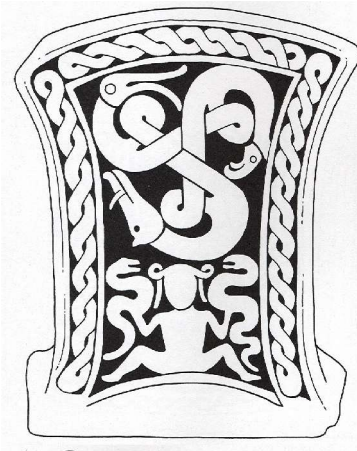

Tournament of Chivalry

April 15th-17th- Apex NC

Once again the young adults of Atlantia are hosting a day of tournaments to celebrate martial prowess and chivalry. The Barony of Windmasters' Hill invites one and all to attend the second Tournament of Chivalry on April 16th 2005 in Apex, NC.

As a highlight of the martial activities Atlantia's Knights challenge any who would face them on the tournament field in a variety of weapons forms. A field will also be available for those who wish to further their skills outside the tournament. Her Majesty, Her Excellency and their Ladies will be casting watchful eyes upon the field and taking particular interest in Chivalric acts. Prizes will be awarded for valor and prowess. Other martial activities will include Rapier, Target Archery and Youth Combat.

All gentles are encouraged to display their talents in the A&S competitions, with documentation requested. There will be separate competitions for adults and youth. Competitions will include: Field presence (by individuals and households), Heraldic Art, and poetry with the theme of Chivalry. For those whose strengths are in the Bardic arts as well, there will be a bardic competition as well (with the theme of chivalry) for all ages.

Saturday evening will boast a feast crafted by Lord William McFadyzean and his mentor, Master Oshi.

The **SITE** is Optimist Farm, 2900 Optimist Farm road, Apex, NC. The site will open Friday, 15 April and close 12 noon on Sunday April 17th. The site is wet. Pets are allowed but must be on a leash and attended by an adult at all times. Pets are not allowed in buildings. Ground fires are permitted in designated areas and in portable fire pits. Tent camping is plentiful and there will be port-a-castles provided.

Directions to site:

FROM THE NORTH, WEST AND EAST: Make your best way to Raleigh, NC. At Raleigh get on route 440 (the beltline that goes around Raleigh). Go to the Southside of town to Exit 298A which is Rt 401S to Fayetteville and Garner. Go south on 401, stay on the right because after 1.4 miles the road forks. Stay on the right when it does and go another 5.3 miles to TenTen road (rt 1010) and turn right. Go 0.5 miles and turn left onto Lake Wheeler road. Go 1.2 miles and turn right onto Optimist Farm road. Go 0.9 miles and turn right into Optimist farm, there will be SCA signs.

FROM THE SOUTH: from Route 95 go North on Route 401. After you make it through Fuquay Varina you will come to alight on the edge of town. On the left there is a Sheetz gas station, a car wash and an Exxon. Start measuring from there and 2.8 miles north you will come to a five way intersection at a light. Turn left onto Hilltop Needmore Road, go 0.4 miles to the next light, turn right onto Lake Wheeler road. Go 2.3 miles and turn left onto Optimist Farm road. Go 0.9 miles and turn right into Optimist farm, there will be SCA signs

Baron's Weapon of the Month Tourney (a message from Their Excellencies)

We have been sponsoring a series of tournaments to be held at the canton fighter practices between February and August with a final tournament to determine the overall champion at the September baronial fighter practice. Each tournament will be fought with a different weapon style with the last one having rotating styles for each round.

The purpose of these tournaments is to encourage our heavy fighters to learn and become proficient in all the weapons of the lists. As these tournaments will be held during regular fighter practices, authorization in the weapon for that month is not required but is highly recommended. Please use this as an opportunity to learn to fight with and authorize in all of these forms.

The format for each tournament will be at the whim of the Baron and based on how many fighters wish to participate. All fighters are encouraged to fight in as many of the tournaments as they are able with members of the Order of Chivalry, who have won a tournament with that weapon at some point in the past, being asked to act as marshals and coaches for that month.

The dates and places have been tentatively selected based on being near the end of the month, on the Baron's ability to be present and an attempt to spread them around the Barony. The proposed schedule is:

The next round will be held at Buckston's practice on March 29th and will be with pole arm. We encourage the populace to come out and support our fighters. To this end we ask that all who attend dress as usual for an SCA event insofar as they are able. We recognize that gentles may be coming from other venues and may not be able to dress in costume.
