Her Excellency hopes that she can live up to such a wonderful accolade.

At the evening court (which was intended to only last about 15 minutes) Olivier (the artist formerly known as Olsk) amused one and all with his presentation to Lord Dunstan, who gave as good as he received. The just in time arrival of (The Honorable) Lord Justus allowed His Highness and Their Excellencies to induce him and Lord Dunstan to perform their duet. His Excellency will also be present with our teams.

Her Excellency asks that all who are able attend the Baronial Sewing Workshop at her house on July 4th from 10am to 6pm. We will be working on the tabards, cloaks, and baldrics for the Barony as well as possibly doing some painting of the sheet walls and new canton banners for the Pennsic encampment, weather permitting. Windmasters' Hill is the best barony in Atlantia (actually in the Known World), and we should look as impressive as we are! There is much to be done to achieve this goal, and your help is needed, wanted, and will be greatly appreciated! Many thanks to Lady Sveva, Lady Therasia, and Mistress Clare de Crécy in getting these projects going. If you are able to help with the sewing outside of the workshop, please contact Lady Sveva.

As always, our thanks to those of you who have attended us over the past months. Your help and assistance mean so much. Minutes from the Baronial Meeting that took place on June 19th, 2005

Which occurred at Carolina Pines
As taken by Dunstan LeHeryngmongere

Meeting was called to order at 4:15 with approximately 25 people in attendance.

His Excellency began the meeting by pointing out that it had been a good Baronial Fighter practice but that even more people were needed, as the Baronial Practice was the only consistent opportunity all month for the Barony to practice unit tactics. He pointed out several opportunities are available to those training for Pennsic and he expressed the desire to have all people authorized in both heavy and rapier to fight in both heavy and rapier at Pennsic. Beer run this year at Pennsic will fall be done by His excellency and Dunstan LeHeryngmongere.

The Baronessa mentioned that the Midsummer's Twilight tourney was a most excellent event. Sewing day will be at her house on July 4th, and many people are needed in this important attempt to get the spiff factor up for the Barony. She asked all Canton seneschals to contact Lady Sveva to let her know how exactly canton heraldry should be presented on the sheet walls.

Officer reports

Chirurgion- Galen reported that Andreas (sp?) will be stepping up as Baronial Waterbearer.

Chirurgion- Dunstan reported that 20th is still deadline for the windlore and wished all those attending for whom it was relevant a happy fathers day.

Heavy Marshall- Wystan reported a good Baronial Practice. 17th of July is the next one.

Rapier Marshall- reported that Lady Ysane raised \$150.00 for the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation at the Sapphire Joust fundraiser. Yeah! He also reported that the Atlantian 5-man rapier battle is coming to Pennsic on war week and he encourages Windmasters' Hill to field a team.

Archery marshall-Manus reported that the shoot at MTT was a success.

MoAS- Sveva mentioned that her warrant is up in September and that she has no intention of renewing her warrant at this time so she is seeking a replacement. Shield walls for Pennsic are underway and it would be nice to get them all hemmed before the July 4th workshop. Contact her for details on how to help.

MoL- Maddelena reported that the office is still in transition. Zita will be taking over and she needs deputies. James of Middle Aston reminded the populace that many fighter's cards had recently expired or would soon.

Quartermaster- Idonea has bought trays for the Barony. She asks that people start being very specific about what they want when they are requesting the use of Baronial equipment and that they sign everything in and out through her.

Warlord- said it was a good practice but we needed more fighters.

The **Triton Herald** (Eogan) then stood up to mention a couple of things, including that the person filming our fighter practice today was eager to film more SCA stuff. He reminded the populace that Atlantia has no sumptuary laws and so seating at things like feasts was up to the coordinators at that particular event and those attending. He also mentioned that the Baronial Gallery was not a tent for the populace (which it was sometimes turning out to be) and that the space of their Excellencies should be respected at all times. Her Excellency added to that that they loved having company but sometimes needed space and time. A suggestion to make sure there was a tent for the populace (and that is was ok'ed by the field coordinator) was offered and welcomed.

The **Seneschal** mentioned that the exchequer's report should be turned in and put in the next Windlore. He thanked Piero and Trephina and Marion and Irmgart for the excellent response he got from the Sanford dancing demo. (Idonea then suggested we ask people who liked our demos to send letters to the seneschal so we have them on record).

Canton reports:

Atilium – not present, but it was mentioned what a fine job they did supplying dinner at Midsummer's Tourney.

Buckston – Midsummer's Twilight Tourney went well. There were about 160 people in attendance. The festival for the Eno demo will be July 2nd-4th and still needs people to help out at it.

Elvegast – July 2nd there will be a sewing workshop at Lady Rosalind's house. There are multiple library demos throughout July (including July 8th, 15th, 23rd and 24th) and help is needed at all of them. Contact the seneschal to sign up for any of them. Directions to any of them can be found at

Fighter practices will still be Sundays at Carolina pines at 1:00pm.

Kappellenburg – Fighter practices are now every other Thursday at Homestead Park at 7:00pm. K-berg is now looking for a nice site to host a midwinter event and welcomes suggestion.

Nimenfeld - Fighter practices are back to Wednesday again. Nimenfeld is still working on Cattle raids and still needs a Rapier MoL.

Regarding Pennsic

Her Excellency mentioned that 62 people that she knew of were now registered to camp with the Barony, which was too many to fit on last year's space and so we will be moved. There will be a pre Pennsic planning party sometime in July/early August at a date to be announced. Nikulai has found out that it will cost approximately 600.00 a year to rent a 10' x 10' storage room down the street from Cooper's Lake if the Barony wanted to start storing stuff up there all year long for Pennsic. Much discussion and debate ensued about whether or not to do this. A motion was made to put forth the money but a tie vote caused the motion not to pass.

July 30th there will be a party at their excellencies house. Details to be posted later.

Baronial meeting will be at Carolina Pines on Sunday, July 17th at 4:00pm. Directions are posted below.

The Baronial Meeting was adjourned at approximately 5:50 pm. Here ends the minutes.

Windmasters' Hill Scriptorium: We will be preparing scroll blanks for Pennsic awards (who will give their all on the field of battle?) and looking ahead to Celtic Cattle Raids. Need I mention that the Scriptorium is eagerly awaiting assignments for the Baronial backlog?

The Glassworkers Guild: There are a number of new books floating around giving glassworkers new ideas to try so come and experiment with a new technique. New glassworkers are welcome. Baron's Weapon of the Month Tourney (a message from Their Excellencies)

We have been sponsoring a series of tournaments to be held at the canton fighter practices between February and August with a final tournament to determine the overall champion at the September baronial fighter practice. Each tournament will be fought with a different weapon style with the last one having rotating styles for each round.

The purpose of these tournaments is to encourage our heavy fighters to learn and become proficient in all the weapons of the lists. As these tournaments will be held during regular fighter practices, authorization in the weapon for that month is not required but is highly recommended. Please use this as an opportunity to learn to fight with and authorize in all of these forms.

The format for each tournament will be at the whim of the Baron and based on how many fighters wish to participate. All fighters are encouraged to fight in as many of the tournaments as they are able with members of the Order of Chivalry, who have won a tournament with that weapon at some point in the past, being asked to act as marshals and coaches for that month.

The dates and places have been tentatively selected based on being near the end of the month, on the Baron's ability to be present and an attempt to spread them around the Barony. The proposed schedule is:
