

I am pleased to announce that all five cantons, and one stronghold now have active chatelaines, and every one of them is a wonderful choice.

I am looking for deputies! If you're interested, please let me know.

Ymir is coming up! One of the biggest events in the Barony and the first event of the tourney season, it's a great one to attend. That said, I offer a few suggestions for those new to the game and/or the SCA to help with your first Ymir.

* Consider your garb. Ymir is usually very cold, and the "I-Dream-Of-Jeannie" sort-of-middle-eastern would generally be a BAD idea. If you need help making warmer garb, or would like to borrow warmer garb, see your group chatelaine, or email me. You can also look at the Ymir Website;

http://sca.daysofyoreevents.com/ymir.htm for more information. I highly recommend the "Keeping Warm link to your attention. *Extra socks. Thick socks. Ymir can be squishy. Did I mention extra socks?

*Check the event schedule to see if there's anything in particular you would like to see ahead of time. That way you won't miss anything.

*A few cabins are unheated, but have outlets for portable heaters or electric blankets. Check with the reservationist to see what you'll need.

*Feast gear - If you are onboard for feast, you will need your own plate/bowl/utensils. A mug, if nothing else, is absolutely vital, for drinking non-alcoholic beverages throughout the day.

*Day of the event, go forth, and have fun! If you need a place to hang out, sit down, relax, the chatelaines will be running Newcomer's Point for most of the day, and you're welcome. Even if you're not new, you're welcome to come and visit for a while.

The next Baronial Meeting is at Falcon Park - East Academy Street & Falcon Drive, Fuquay-Varina, NC 27526.

Directions:

Take your best route to Fuquay-Varina. If coming from the north go straight into town on 401 South. You will pass a strip Mall on the left that has the Guardian Angel thrift store there. The next light is Academy Street. Make the left and look for the signs. If coming from the south part of town go straight into town. You will come up to the intersection where Hwy 55 makes a left. There is a new tire and battery store on the right. Make that right at the light. That is Academy Street. Look for the signs. If coming from the west(Holly Springs, Apex) on Hwy 55. Come on into Fuquay. You will make a right and go over some railroad tracks. Hwy 55 makes a left at that light but you want to go straight across onto Academy Street. Look for the signs.

The Story of Ymir

Norse creation Myth. as interpreted by Dunstan LeHeryngmongere, primarily from the Prose Edda

With Ymir rapidly coming towards us, I thought it would be good to revisit exactly who Ymir was and why it is important to realize that North Carolina is, according to the Norse myths, quite likely just a part of a giant's pancreas.- Dunstan

In the beginning, there was Ginnungagap, the great void. It was bordered by Nifleheim (the land of fog) and Muspell (a place of great heat and flame). A river flowed through Ginnungagap and had frozen over, layer upon layer. But where the heat of Muspell met the cold the cold of Nifleheim the ice began to melt. The ice dripping from Ginnungagap formed the great Giant, Ymir. It also formed a vast cow named Audhumla.

Ymir, once formed, fed from the milk of the giant cow Audhumla. As he grew, from the armpits of this great Giant formed the first two frost giants, and they had many children who were of the race of giants. Audhumla itself fed by licking the salt from the stones within this great icy river. Such was it's appetite as it licked the salt from the stones that on the first day it's licking had melted enough ice that one of the stones appeared to be covered in hair. On the second day, a man's head appeared from the stone and on the third day the entire man had been loosed from the ice of the river. This man was named Buri. Buri then found himself a wife and had a son named Bor. Bor married a giantess and had three sons, and they were named Vili, Ve and Odin. The viking stories tell us that these were the first true Gods.

Ymir was a hard master, and refused to allow his progeny to make homes of their own. Because of this, his sons and his son's sons became angry. After a time, the three sons of Bor decided they had had enough, and they went to Ymir and without hesitation they slew him. Now it happened that Ymir was so vast and tremendous of a being that his blood spilling out made a tidal wave across the land, slaying every one of the race of giants but for one family of giants. The Head of this family was named Bergelmir, and he and his family escaped riding a small ark. They went on later to parent the entire new races of giants.

Odin and his brothers proceeded to carry the body of Ymir into the very middle of Ginnunga-gap and started the very first recycling program in recorded history by recycling the body of Ymir. First they removed his flesh and with it they formed the solid earth upon which we now stand. His bones they made into the mountains and the crags. His teeth they removed and made into the smaller rocks and slate of the world. The blood left in his body became the oceans and the rivers and the seas. His skull they removed and they set it above the earth to become the sky. They called forth four dwarves, who were named North, South, East, and West, to hold this skull up above the earth. They caught sparks from Muspell and set them up high in the skull to be the stars in the sky.

They then removed Ymir's massive eyebrows and out of them they fashioned a protecting wall to keep the Giants at bay. Within this wall is the earth we live on, and it is called Midguard. Last of all, they removed the stray thoughts from Ymir's head and flung them in fluffy globs into the sky to form the clouds.

Within this world and the world around it the Gods dwelt, as did the lesser god-like beings (Like the Valkyries and the fates) and the races of giants, elves, and men. And so the world was made, and continues on until the day it must end in the bloody battle of Ragnarok.

Martial Activities will be many and varied, including Rapier, Heavy and Youth Combat.

Merchants are heartily welcome!

Feasting will be sumptuous, and presented by Mistress Clare de Crécy. There are a limited number seats, so please reserve early.

A&S Competitions will also be numerous, and will include Norse accessories, Norse mariner/fishing gear, Norse literature/poetry and best decoration of a Viking garment.

The SITE is Camp Kanata, 13524 Camp Kanata Road, Wake Forest, NC 27587. The site opens at 5:00 PM on Friday and closes at noon on Sunday. This is a DRY site. Neither camping nor pets are permitted. The site has cabins with electricity, and space heaters (one per cabin) and electric blankets are permitted. Cabin space is limited, so reserve early. (Paid reservations only.) SITE DIRECTIONS:

From I-85 (North or South):

Take exit 218; go south on US 1 towards Raleigh. Take the exit for NC Hwy 98; turn Right at bottom of ramp. Go 2.3 miles, then turn Right onto Camp Kanata Road. The camp will be on the Right, a little over 2 miles from NC Hwy 98.

From Raleigh and points South:

From the I-440 Beltline take US 1 North (Capital Boulevard) out of Raleigh. Near Wake Forest, take the exit for NC Hwy 98, turning Left at the bottom of the ramp. Go 2.3 miles, then turn Right onto Camp Kanata Road. The camp will be on the Right, a little over 2 miles from NC Hwy 98.

War of the Wings:

In the Beginning...
