

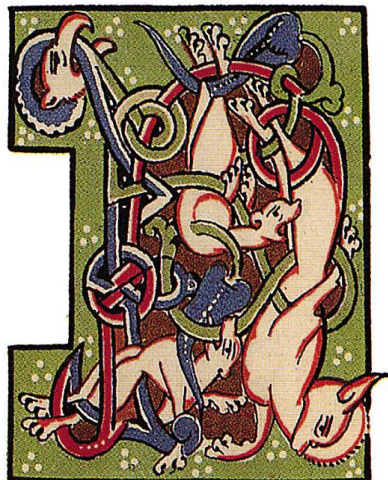

Letter from Their Excellencies

Greetings unto the People of Windmasters' Hill,

We have had a great decision hanging over us for in the past few months. Having arrived at our decision after much thought and discussion, we come to you with both great sorrow and relief. We have informed TRM that we will not seek a second term as Baron and Baroness of this great barony. While we have been encouraged by many of you to continue to serve, we question how effective we can be with our new addition. We both strongly agree that family must come first, and so, we have asked for a polling for new Baronage. Our new baronial seneschal Matsuura Suetsunae will be accepting nominations until the next baronial meeting on October 15th. We encourage all to consider serving as baronage and will be attending the various canton meetings in the next few weeks in order to answer questions as to what the responsibilities are of the position.

With that said, we have not yet accomplished all of the goals we set for ourselves when we stepped up and have a number of projects we wish to complete in the next five months.

- ◇ New coronets - We have asked the barony to approve our consulting with Master Blackwood as to design and cost of new coronets. Windmasters' has the heaviest coronets in the kingdom (not a good thing) and we wish to lift a great weight from those who follow in our place as well as relieving them of many headaches.
- ◇ We intend to meet with all of our seneschals to rationalize the assignment of zip codes among the cantons.
- ◇ Having consulted with the Eogan several times, we will implement our new awards to broaden the ways your baronage may recognize the populous.
- ◇ Completion of the Baronial Beautification project - there are still a few sheet walls to paint!

We have a full slate of events coming up. As we write this we are readying for Cattle Raids which are sure will again be a mooovelous event. We also have Kingdom Crusades and ask all our fighters to come support our glorious Kingdom of Atlantia. War of the Wings follows two weeks later where we call on everyone to come and support Windmasters' Hill. Do you really want to have to listen to those Sacred Stoners brag for the next year? Let us show them which Barony is the greatest in the Kingdom, and therefore, the Known World!

After the wars have passed, remember the Passage of Arms hosted by Elvegast. This special event features a tournament modeled after those of the late 14th and 15th centuries. Except for no passes with lance on horseback, this style of combat is how tournaments in the "high" middle ages were done. The weekend after the Pas, there is a Horse and Hound event out on the coast which we also ask you to support. The event hosts graciously agreed to move the date of their event so it would not conflict with our Pas de Arms. We appreciate their gesture and will thank them with our attendance. (The Barun also wants to ride.)

My apologies go to you, the populace, for not having posted the directions to the last Baronial Business meeting. I shall try harder in the future to get the information in time to post it to the windlore.

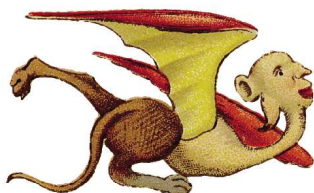

The Cantons are making a concerted effort to bring their newcomers to events. People are being outfitted with outfits, coached through the event schedule and promised an eye-opening time.

Most of us, despite whatever research we did or how many local meetings we attended, didn't "get" the SCA until we attended our first event. We had an experience that beguiled us, intrigued us, and left us wanting more. The SCA is built on these moments, these experiences. The desire to create an experience for another is at the core of our service, the urge to beautify and deepen the experience inspires our Arts and Sciences and the drive to live the experience is the essence of our activities on the list field and in the Court and feast hall.

4. Don't over-commit. Events are fun. This is your hobby. Balance is essential.
5. Attend Court. It's great theater. You do your hosts and the Royalty respect by attending. Fun and surprising things can happen.
6. Try something new. Take a class or approach one of our talented artisans for a demonstration, especially if they are doing something you find intriguing.

Take a moment every now and then to stop and look around. Relax and enjoy!

Le pas d'armes de l'Arbre d'or November 10-12, 2006 Canton of Elvegast

Let it be known that on the eleventh day of November, Anno Societatis Forty One, the Canton of Elvegast in the Kingdom of Atlantia will host a Pas d' Armes in celebration of the marriage of Margaret of York to Charles the Bold, Duke of Burgundy, for such a day of pageantry, chivalry, and celebration shall not soon be repeated.

The spectacle of the processions, pageantry, and banquets that did accompany the nuptials of Margaret of York (sister to King Edward IV of England) to Charles the Bold, Duke of Burgundy in July of 1468 was such that contemporaries did wonder at the wealth and splendour of the Burgundian court. The highlight of the festivities was a Pas d'Armes held in the Market Place at Bruges.

Martial Activities: All participants shall conduct themselves with the utmost care to advance the ideals of chivalry. Each will be announced as they enter the field the first time. You are encouraged to bring your own herald, banners, etc. to make your presence known and add to the day's pageantry. There shall be single rounds of combat both at the barrier and one against the other. At the end of the day, a grand melee shall commence. He who would win the day will be the most gracious of fighters though he may not prove himself most victorious. For more information about weapons and armour requirements as well as a more detailed description of the tournament, please see the event website or contact the Marshal in Charge, Mestre Callistus Gill (callixtus.gill@gmail.com or 919-844-4423 NLT 10 PM).

Arts & Sciences Activities: Our A&S activities for the day will focus heavily on the 14th and 15th Centuries. Our first activity will be a competition for best heraldic display with prizes awarded to best heraldic display by a household as well as best heraldic display by an individual. Documentation for this competition is encouraged but not required. Entrants are requested to display their entries for the heraldic display competition on the field to help add to the glory and pageantry of the day. In addition to the heraldic display competition there will also be an open display in which all artisans are invited to display completed works as well as works in progress. Active displays are welcome and all artisans are invited to spend time with their displays during the day to discuss their arts with the populace and fellow artisans. Documentation is strongly encouraged for entries in the open display.
