Seneschal's Letter:

At Unevent I learned that I'd be stepping up as Seneschal of the oldest and coolest Barony in the Kingdom. Many thanks to Chow for his aid in a swift transition and for his good advice. I'd also like to thank everyone for their words of congratulation and support. I'd also like to thank Trephina for hitting the ground running as our new Baronial exchequer. She's aggressive, thorough and a good communicator, and I feel confident knowing that she is there.

A little over a month ago our group was called into account for a number of infractions that boil down to not being aware of and our policies and following them, and not sufficiently documenting and reporting our activities. This is not unique to our group, and this year the Kingdom has taken the stance of enforcing its policies. Therefore, the Barony has been placed on a probation that limits our financial activities, which will give is the breathing room to focus on closing 2007 on time with our records in order and up to date.

All gloom and doom? Well, no! I saw five cantons work together professionally and in record time to take over what is essentially a Kingdom-level Baronial event on short notice and nail down the financial arrangements – even with the obstacles presented by following their policies to the letter. Many thanks to the Canton of Elvegast for taking over the official financial responsibility for the event and for all the other cantons for joining with them and pooling their funds to keep Ymir going into its 33 rd year. This is not the first time that Ymir has been hosted by a canton rather than the Barony, but it's the first time the finances have been supported across the Barony.

We've also completed an inventory of the Baronial Shed in Fuquay so that a sortable file can be available for anyone that needs to actually find something in there. (Thanks are due to to Beatricce, Trephina, His Excellency, and Duncan de Brus for over four hours of sorting, stacking and tallying.)

The Kingdom Seneschal and the Kingdom Exchequer are impressed with the swiftness and the manner in which we have met these challenges, and at such a busy and stressful time of year. There are a good number of things that I hope to accomplish in the coming months with your help, but for the present, I hope you'll all have the time to relax and enjoy the holidays and catch your breath before the busy months ahead.

Notes from the Baronial Meeting, December 11:

Lady Elspeth began a short Nimenfeld meeting at 7:35, and then turned the floor over to Lady Ursula, who opened the baronial meeting at 7:38.

Baroness: Ursula immediately transferred the floor to Baroness Rosalind, who mentioned the financial issues facing the Barony and continued to say how impressed she was by the cantons and how they stepped forward to ensure that Ymir was successful in 2008.

Seneschal: Ursula then announced that Lady Trephina would cover the Exchequer business, and reported for the officers who couldn't attend (Full reports are elsewhere in the Windlore). There is a new A&S website, which will be linked to the baronial website soon. KASF needs volunteers, and the University could use a southern site so the someone might want to look into NC State. A&S reports are due from cantons. Chirurgeon – Lord Andreas reports no new business, and asks everyone to look for people to send recommendations for. Herald: couldn't make it, but he has a deputy (Lady Rae) now.

Exchequer: Trephina gave her report as the new baronial exchequer. Her Excellency interrupted to ask everyone to hug her for taking over on short notice. Trephina continued, and stated that at Unevent, there was a meeting with the Kingdom Seneschal, Kingdom Exchequer, Regional Exchequer, etc. She is waiting on a list of everything that needs to happen, but stated that everything that can be fixed before Dec. 31 will be. The Barony is, effective December 1, on "Financial Probation", which started at Unevent and continuing through the first quarter. The Barony will have to ask permission to spend money, from the Regional Exchequer or Kingdom Exchequer. We can receive and spend money, though we can't run an event. (The cantons are handling Ymir). The baronial financial policy will need to be updated this year, though please be careful looking at the kingdom website because it is under construction - look at the society version (2007) to ensure you're up to date. The Barony had a financial policy approved on the website in 2001, and we approved another one in 2003 which kingdom approved with one change (check copies have to be shredded after they clear/event is over). Cantons should follow suit in reviewing the books - everyone needs to look at their financial policy, which needs to be submitted with the Doomsday report. Moving forward, the exchequer and Seneschal will need to work together more closely - the Seneschal will be required to initial bank statements, etc. The most current financial policy has been put on the website, but more work needs to occur (reselling feast seats, bid process, who we comp, etc). A committee will be making these changes. In the future, allocations will be listed in the Windlore and/or Exchequer report. Allocations are being realigned, for instance we need to ensure that there is a \$500 emergency fund at-all-times. Trephina will be updating frequently to ensure everyone knows what's going on. She would like canton exchaquers to send her financial policies, and to cc her on canton quarterly reports. Gaston asked whether financial policy could be written such that cantons had to report; Nikulai stated that the Society Board of Directos had said no, because each canton is a financially independent group. Trephina continued to say she just wanted to help groups make sure they met all requirements. Pennsic will no longer be run through the Barony. We will move baronial bank accounts to another bank to comply with Society signature card rules.

Notes from the Baronial Meeting, December 11, Continued:



Chatelaine: Ursula then called on Lady Eibhlin. She reported on notes from Unevent: All demos must be approved by the Seneschal, all demo fighters must be authorized, and whack-a-knight is ok for kids under 12 to hit armored fighter with foam weapon. There is also now an official Atlantian Newcomer badge (see picture). These were cast by the Kingdom Chatelaine and will be available to newcomers who may choose to wear them on a blue and white cord. If you see anyone wearing one of these tokens, please make an effort to greet them as as a newcomer to our Society. Attillium also had a demo on Sat that was well attended by SCA members and poorly attended by the public.

Chronicler: Guenièvre reported that she'd be handling the January Windlore, and needed submissions, but has a fabulous deputy.

Rapier Marshal: Lord Wystric wasn't present at the meeting, but has a report in the Windlore.

Archery: Lord Manus reported that not a lot of archer was happening, due to the cold dark days. There will be archery at Ymir.

Web Minister: Lord Malcom noted that if offices change, he needed permission to post in order to change the official email addresses. He asked that officers please indicate what they wanted public. Baron Gaston

wondered whether movie and beach preferences were applicable, Malcom offered to find him a different website.

Quatermaster: A baronial inventory held on Saturday, and some things were removed - flammables, "baronial tiger trap", the "box of broken arrow" which may have been the original Pennsic arrow, etc. There were also some old lost and found items, older than 2 years, which are now in the keeping of the Senschal. They will reappear later (including the "eyewatering" apparel such as a shirt in fuschia and matching electric green pants). The 4 page single-space list has now been condensed to an excel spreadsheet, which will be posted on the baronial webpage for ease of use. Things have been reorganized for more manageability, and labeled. The baronial eric has been sorted into "needs work" and "good"; Falcone may fix or may ask for help.

Minister of the Lists: Lady Rose reported on behalf of Lady Helwynn. There are new forms for youth and equestrian, if you are a warranted MoL, please sit at a youth MoL table to familiarize yourself with the changes. The MoL fighter lists have become password protected, for privacy reasons.

Minister of Minors: It was reported that Lady Mariana now has a deputy.

Seneschal: Ursula reported that she became the official Seneschal last week. She went on to discuss Unevent - even though the Review of Books was 4 pages long, most of that was citations and redundancies - it's really about a page, much of which was administrative points (reports unsigned, checks not deposited within 15 days, etc). Cantons should consider this as headsup to look at themselves. Ursula will also be checking the officer listings, etc, to ensure everything is up to date, etc. Make sure if you're an officer you have given permission to publish contact information. The Kingdom website has lots of info, policies on financial policies etc, so please check your respective office's manuals if applicable. Phillipa is the deputy Baronial Seneschal. Ursula concluded by mentioning that a lot of people have offered to help with her new job as senschal, but stated that anything anyone does to help anyone in the barony is great, not just things that help her directly.

Minster of Arts Report:

There are a number of things to discuss about A&S, but I will be unable to make the meeting tonight.

- (1) For those who have not been there yet, please visit http://as.windmastershill.org and let me know what you think. Feel free to request an account.
- (2) Kingdom A&S is looking for volunteers. I'm sure they can use your skills if you are interested. There are lots of jobs that still need filling.
- (3) University would like a southern (NC or SC) site for the next university and it looks like we might be able to host it at NCState for free. Would any canton or the barony be willing to be the official backer of a bid?
- (4) It's time for quarterly reports. If you are the Canton moas, please get these to me ASAP. If you do not have a canton moas, this is the seneschal's responsibility. A&S is how we keep our non-profit status, so these reports are important.

Notes from the Baronial Meeting, December 11, Continued:

Canton Reports: Nimenfeld will not be having a 2nd meeting in December due to Christmas, and the archery practice is on hold for the winter. As a point of interest, it was noted that golf tube combat arrows were recently banned. Attilium will be changing several officers in January: marshal, chatelaine and Mol. 1 member recently returned from deployment, 2 deployed, 3 are getting ready to go, Business meetings are on the 3rd Thursday at anew location, practice on Saturdays at Lake Rim Park - these things may change after January. Atillium had christmas party last weekend – everyone should think about attending it next year because it's fun to watch gifts get stolen at the white elephant exchante. The 3rd Thursday of January will be the baronial meeting, directions will be posted. Buckston is not meeting on Christmas or New Year's - there will be a holiday potluck on the 18th. They have allocated money for ymir. Phillipa also reports that Buckston has lots of dancing, please come and dance. (Valdemar announced later there was no fighter practice at the church until the new year, and that he will be running an armor workshop for Wisby coats for the new guys - discussion of details ensued. Elvegast - is "sponsor" group for Ymir, other cantons are donating. Questions should go to Phillipa as coautocrat. Meetings are on Thursday nights, but the is university closed next week and christmas week. If NCSU is closed, meeting will be at Two Guys Pizza. There will be no meeting on christmas; meeting will be at Two Guys January 3. Sunday fighter practice is suspended until after 12th night. Kberg reports that attendence has been good and that the canton voted for and allocated the \$1200 for Ymir. A potluck dessert revel will be held on the 17th, Buckston is dropping in to "share culture". Rapier practice is still on Thursdays, and no meetings will be held on Christmas Eve or New Years Eve.

Old Business: The new coronets were delivered by Barun Geoffery and Baronessa Maddalena to much applause.

Ymir: A well attended staff meeting was held on Sunday, highlights include:

- Falcone will be running fighting as a standard double-elim.
- Site opens at 5 for the public, noon for staff.
- Phillipa asked everyone to come help out, bring people and it'll be a really good event.
- Site is gorgeous and has many amenities, please bring everyone you know.
- If you want to help, please look at the staff list and offer.
- Remember: this event makes the WH budget.
- There will be a silent/live auction to benefit the Barony organized by Duchess Padraign please contact her if you'd like to donate "high quality items".

New Guest from the Outlands: Robert Blackhawk moved in from the Outlands in the last few months and has a coronation gift from the Outlands that needs to go to Their Royal Highnesses. Because of his schedule, he can't guarantee he'll be at Coronation or any other local events any time in the near future. It was noted that if he brings the gift to a later meeting he can find someone to take it to Ymir.

New Years' Eve Party: Baronessa Maddalena will be having her traditional "Formal as you want to be" New Year's Party, starting at 8PM on New Year's Eve. Bring food and beverages to share. Wear whatever makes you happy, as long as it involves clothing. On that note, the meeting ended @ 8:42.
