

Greetings from the Exchequer for the Great Barony of Windmasters' Hill!

What a difference a day makes! Today is the day after the February Baronial Meeting. As the Chronicler's minutes indicate, the populous voted to un-allocate all allocations except those required by the current financial policy. Thus, the current figures for the Baronial accounts are: Total funds are \$11,937.76 of which \$550.00 is allocated (\$500 for Baronial Emergency Funds and \$50 for the Baronage Discretionary Fund), and \$11,387,76 is unallocated. At the February Baronial meeting the Barony did approve making \$630.00 available if we need to pay the full deposit for the Farm Ventures site for June 14th.

This month I am working on switching banks. We will be moving to Wachovia rather than SunTrust since SunTrust now charges service fees to non-profit organization accounts.

As promised, I am providing the summary figures from the 2006 and 2007 Domesday Reports. (Chronicler's Mote: These are found on page *) If you have any questions please don't hesitate to contact me. I appreciate everyone's continued support. The Barony is doing well and we are on track in addressing the recommendations from the Review of Books.

Motes from the Baronial Meeting, February 19:

Ursula began the meeting at 7:15, though then it was noted that is was published as 7:30 and it was noted that it shouldn't start until the published time. Ursula asked that people please tell her if something is wrong on the website, please let her know. There was a pause for food.

Meeting started again @ 7:30. Ursula began by apologizing for the cramped space (the meeting was held at the home of the Baronial Seneschal due to the continuing renovations at Buckston's normal location) and thanking everyone for coming. She asked that officers kept things concise due to the location. She then turned the meeting over to the Baronage.

Baron: His Excellency opened by talking about Ymir, which was great, and he hoped that it was as good for everyone else as it was for the Baronage. The new site brought new challenges, and everyone pulled together even though there was some confusion in places and could have gone badly. Baron Gaston mentioned that he'd like people to be more respectful of the Royalty and the Game we play, especially around newcomers. He continued speaking of baronial togetherness and how one never knew who was looking up to you, and how we should all be a good example for each other. He concluded by stating that he wanted to start a

canton recruitment / retention program over the next 6-8 months – Windmasters Hill has a great location, good sites, and enough money, and the people we have are wonderful, but in order to continue to grow as a Barony we need more people.

Baroness: We need a Pennsic Camp Steward soon, though a few people have expressed interest. We also want to have a ymir bid in may or june so that it can be approved in July. We can't pick a bid in December anymore, and have Ymir run in the way it's supposed to - and the Kingdom loves Ymir. To make sure we have a site next year, Betsy Jeff Penn is reserved for the 13th/14th/15th of February, 2009, but if someone finds a better one that's great too.

Exchequer: Trephina passed out a list of allocations, as shown in the last Windlore, and asked that allocations be removed if not required by baronial policy – which states we have to keep \$550 allocated for discretionary fund and emergency fund. Background checks for Youth Officers have begun. The Kingdom Youth Officer has stated that as this process is still undergoing testing she will notify those chosen to submit their information. I have been chosen for the first round of submission, so if all goes well our Barony will be one of the first to be compliant with the new rules.

The following are the relevant excerpts from the announcements I received. Please keep this in mind if you are planning any events or activities involving children.

"As was announced last year, the SCA is implementing a background check policy for the benefit of our membership and the organization. The background checks will be performed by a properly licensed vendor for all persons in leadership and supervisory roles that may require contact with otherwise unchaperoned minors. Officials who are required to have background checks include, but are not limited to, youth activities officers at all levels, adults acting as youth marshals for any martial activity, persons organizing/in charge of youth activities for events.

This policy will be implemented on February 15, 2008. The Kingdom Seneschals will be informing those who need to undergo background checks of this requirement. Current officers requiring background checks that are subject to this policy will have 4 weeks to return the appropriate paperwork before their warrants will be revoked. Any questions concerning the implementation of the policy should be directed to your Kingdom Seneschal.

event. Kappellenberg invites everyone to attend the Battle of the Oranges, and still meets on Monday nights.

Seneschal: Ursula reported that a small committee is still reviewing the financial policy - target date is end of March so that it can be reviewed at the end of the meeting. Suspension ends at the end of March. Ideally, we'll vote on the policy at the April meeting, after which it will be sent to Kingdom and when they approve it, it becomes official. The Baronial Calendar has been updated with some formatting changes, and will be added to a Google calendar later, or possibly will be added as a iCalendar on the barony webspace.

She would like to see more small events - geared towards newcomers and towards the barony itself, ie War College, etc. just something to think about.

Ymir: 570 trolled in, \$9,870 deposited, ~\$4,400 profit, has to be given to cantons and then given back to Barony. There were a lot of donations, we should have only made about \$3600. There was a post-mortem meeting after Ymir, which was something new. Notes are available for next year's team, including financials and comments from staff.

New Business: Gaston mentioned we didn't hold a lot of events in 2007, Oranges and Vitus will be nice and small in the spring after the giant Ymir, but also that the "Vice" site (Farm Ventures) is still reserved for June if we wanted to do something. It has a big field and nice hall. Adriana mentioned that she ran a Pas at the same site a few years ago, and would be willing to run the same sort of event again, and would put together an event bid for the Barony for next meeting. Discussion ensued of this idea and other events. Phillipa wants to run a garb wars type event, needs a large room / gymnasium for cheap, in October. If this goes well, we might be able to get a KWCS to Atlantia. Nikulai reported that there would probably not be a Crusades, given that if there wasn't a site by some date that has passed (Coronation?) the 2008 event wouldn't happen. He also moved that we authorize \$630 in case we needed to hold the site immediately. There were objections, based on lack of planning at this point and not wanting the Barony to spend money without a full plan. It was pointed out that the site contract does state that we can get a full refund if we cancel 30 days before the event. If the event runs the same as last time, it'll be about \$3000 according to Adriana. The authorization is just to hold the site if we have to hold the date (according to site rules, we only have to pay the additional site fee immediately if they have other interested parties for that weekend), and authorizing the emergency fee doesn't authorize a particular event. A bid will be picked at the March meeting, so if people have ideas other than the Pas they are welcome to present. The motion to pay for the site only in the event that it was required to hold the date, and contingent upon the ability to cancel 30 days out, was voted upon and passed with 17 in favor and 5 opposed.

Rosalind said that there needed to be a baronial repair day for the eric, tent, maintenance etc. We need to pick a weekend for that, probably in April or possibly in March, there may be multiple days.

Prizes will be given for the fraternity with the best overall performance (relative to size), and the individual with the best overall performance, as well as for the individual A&S competitions.

Analyzing a wand - Part 1, Introduction

Recently I've started studying calligraphy more carefully as I like the "how to" books to an extent but I feel that some of the exemplars in them are more unique than common. I'm not certain of the documentation for some of the claims as well.

Some people say that analyzing the details of a hand is paleography -

"the art of analysing and reading handwriting. Some would call it a science, and to a degree it has acquired a veneer of scientific style, classification and ordering, but ultimately it involves one human individual attempting to understand the unique efforts at communication of another" 1

Is it truly paleography then if you're reproducing the attempts of communication of another instead of just translating their attempts? Most seem to agree that because you're studying someone else's handwriting this is still the study of paleography.

For my first exercise in analyzing a hand I wanted to find a text written by one person that held as many examples as possible of letters and words that I would need for a basic award text. I found countless texts but the most difficult letters to find on the same page were W,Q and K which are letters that we often use in our award texts.

Reminders about the progression of the alphabet noted that I'd probably not find these letters together in one hand until the later time periods. I finally did find a book from 16th century England that not only had the letters I wanted but also had several relevant words that I would want for an award text, ex: king, queen, etc.
