A Note from Their Excellencies:

The arrival of April means that spring is finally here and warmer weather is on its way back. We know several members of our Barony made the trip to Gulf Wars and we are looking forward to hearing all their stories.

The end of Gulf Wars and the arrival of spring mean that we must once again begin to turn our eyes towards the north and begin our preparations for Pennsic. We have still not any volunteers for Pennsic Camp Steward. We were late getting volunteers last year as well but by this time last April Girard, Guenièvre, and Beatrice had stepped forward to take on the task. We have had a Pennsic encampment for many years and it has been home to many members of our Barony. Last year over 80 people called it home and it was a pleasure to have so many members of our populace camping with us. The deadline for group registration is 15 June and if we want to have an encampment we must have a camp steward. For the same reasons that we can no longer wait until the fall to accept bids for Ymir, we as a Barony can no longer afford to wait until May or June to find camp stewards. Thus, we must have a suitable camp steward or a team of stewards by the April Baronial meeting or we will have to cancel the Pennsic Baronial Encampment for this year. Please know that we do not want to have to consider this option but we have grown as a Barony and an encampment to the point where we can no longer wait until the last minute for volunteers. It is also not a job that you have to consider doing alone and the camp steward no longer has to consider setting up the entire encampment on their own. We would love to have a team of camp stewards again and a Brute Squad would again have to be organized to assist the camp steward with land grab and set up. If you want to do the job and have a volunteer that wants to stay the full two weeks and sit on our land, that's great! Please do not be afraid to consider volunteering and if you have any questions, we and several previous camp stewards will be happy to talk to you. (*continued*)

Notes from the Baronial Meeting, February 19:

Ursula began the meeting at 7:50 PM, with thanks Elvegast for hosting and providing such a cool meeting space (Caldwell Lounge at NCSU). She invited Manus, as hosting seneschal to deliver his canton's report first. (This is included with the canton reports below). Amid the munching of a mountain of donated pizza (yay, pizza), the meeting unfolded thus:

Baron: His Excellency reminded everyone that we still need a **camp steward for Pennsic**, and that he and Her Excellency need

A Note from Their Excellencies (Continued):

Pennsic preparations also mean that Baronial War Practice is back in full swing after the long winter months. Please note that War Practice has been changed to the second Saturday of the month and we encourage all our fighters of every discipline to come out so that we can prepare ourselves for the coming battles ahead. Last year Her Excellency issued challenge of her own to each of the Barony's duelist. She pledged to don harness and take the field with the armored fighters for at least one battle at that Pennsic War as a spearman and challenged her rapier fighters to join her. She stood on the field last year as a spearman and a number of valiant fighters met her challenge. We had several newly authorized fighters and new crossovers on the heavy field last year. This year Her Excellency would issue a challenge to every member of her populace. Last year there were 12 heavy, rapier, and archery War Points as well as the A&S display, classes, and Pennsic Choir and we expect similar activities at this coming Pennsic. Her Excellency challenges every member of her Barony to participate in at least one *new* war point or A&S activity this year. This should be a war point or A&S activity that you would not normally participate in. So acquire a new authorization to support your fellow fighters, shoot archery, endeavor to teach this year if you usually attend classes, or bring you best for the A&S display. To that end she is offering her help, in any way she can provide it, to any member of the populace who in support of the Barony takes up her challenge this year at war.

There are several events coming up this spring and we are looking forward to seeing many of you there. It was wonderful to see so many faces at Battle of the Oranges and Her Excellency is looking forward to St. Vitus this month.

He reminded all that Their Excellencies expect **event bids for Ymir** to be in their hands April and May so that they can be accepted and moving forward in June. He stressed that the event has grown to a point that we can't continue to operate as we have in the past;

we need more bids to choose from and more advance planning. He noted that (Camp Betsy-Jeff Penn) has penciled us in for next February (Valentine's Day weekend 2009) but that prospective autocrats are not expected to use that site if they have a better one in mind. Prospective autocrats can contact

Douglas for this past Ymir's financial info and Ursula for all other Ymir archival info. **Baronial practices** will move from the 3rd weekend of the month to the 2nd weekend. [Writer's note: The first official Baronial practice will begin in May, as Elvegast's Renfaire demo falls on the 2nd weekend of April.] Cuan will remain as Baronial Warlord for one more year. His Excellency noted that he took an informal email/IM survey, **"Do you perceive any problems with the Barony?"** He asked that everyone consider the question and would welcome all input, including candid/honest thoughts about Their Excellencies are doing. The results will be consolidated and reviewed with the Seneschal and any interested parties: His Excellency is resolved to have **job descriptions for each of the Baronial Officers** by the next Baronial meeting, and asked that each officer send him a write-up what each of them perceives their job duties to be. In addition to giving current officers clear guidelines, this is intended to give prospective officers a clear picture of what each job entails, to remove the mystery and hopefully make them more inclined to volunteer to be an officer. Malcolm suggested that people should note "extra tasks" separately, these being things that should not necessarily part of the official job description, but that the officer is doing either because they want to or because there is a need that is not being met. Their Excellencies are looking to define the official expectations of those holding the positions of Baronial Champions / Notables as well.

Chatelaine: Not present.

Chirurgion: Not present. Ursula delivered the following report from Andreas: No known problems or issues. We now have two Chirurgeons in Training (CIT) in the area. Andreas will be CiC/WiC at Battle of the Oranges, where waterbearing help would be appreciated. Fighters are encouraged to include endurance exercising, weight loss actions/activities and practice good balanced eating and hydration as the temperatures rise. It is also a great time for all of us to be sure we are up to date with physicals, immunizations, including tetanus and other health care monitoring to ensure we are prepared for spending more time out of doors.

Chronicler: Not present. (Ursula is taking the minutes – and notes for the record that she is a tad late in delivering them. But she did say that The Windlore rocks.)

Exchequer: Trephina announced that Glaxo SmithKline had made a \$500.00 corporate donation to the Barony on behalf of Nikulai and that Nikulai had specified that the funds be earmarked for the Baronial encampment at Pennsic. She noted that not counting the funds received from Ymir, our current account balance is \$11,840 of which \$1,050 is already allocated. Also, the Barony has moved its account to Wachovia, as our former bank can't meet our signature card requirements and charges higher fees. The new signature card would be sent to Kingdom in the next few days, and the Barony's financial probation would end at the end of March.

Herald: Not present. It was reported that the new Baronial awards designs have passed but that there are issues with a few of the award names. She also invited people who are interested in heraldry or in getting a device passed to contact her.

Marshal: Not present. Ursula noted that Wystan is looking for someone to take over the position.

Rapier: Not Present.

Archery: Manus invited anyone interested in archery to contact him.

Arts & Sciences: Not present. Ursula reminded everyone that the Baronial Work Day and Potluck is happening at Daniello's this weekend on Saturday, the 22nd, and that details and directions are on the Baronial Calendar Pages, and that more such workshops will certainly happen in the future.

MoL: Helwyn encouraged anyone interested in learning how to be an MoL to contact her.

Webminister: Malcolm asked that anyone having issues with the Baronial Website, the Forums or The Keep (email listgroup) contact him. Ursula asked if Corwyn was still administering the Baronial Phone list. Malcolm said that Corwyn is. Gaston asked if the phone list administration could be moved to a participating member of the Barony. Nikulai asked if the phone list could be made to be more readable. Malcolm said that he would start a discussion thread on the Baronial Forum about re-doing the phone list. Athos noted that he prefers the old printed format. Several people remarked that they still use their battered old paper phone lists from years ago. Maddalena volunteered to pay for printed copies.

Quartermaster: Not present. Ursula announced that Solvarr would be stepping up to the position. Trephina reported that the shed had been broken into and that ours was among the ones whose locks were cut. She said that Steafan had checked out the shed afterward and nothing appeared to have been stolen and that she gave Steafan hard-to-cut circular lock (Solvarr confirmed this from experience), which has been put on the shed, and the keys will be copied and given to the appropriate folks. Solvarr will be reorganizing the inventory spreadsheet and adding a lot more detail. He also intends to identify things that can be eliminated from the inventory, and is planning on photographing the inventory and uploading the photos to Flickr site for easy reference. Malcolm reported that we have about 100GB of space on windmastershill.org, which is plenty of room to host the photos. On a personal note, Solvarr announced that he is hosting a party for Erica from Nimenefeld, to celebrate her successful defense of her Master's thesis and that the address is 8517 Ten-Ten Road in Raleigh.

Warlord: His Excellency noted that Cuan will remain as Warlord for one more year.

Minister of Minors: Mariana reported that youth background checks were expected to be back by March 15th, but are more likely to be back by April 15th, therefore, the background check requirement will be waived for events happening before then. She noted that she submitted her paperwork as required, and asked that another person step up and get a background check on file so that she will have a backup. She warned that within six years, every event holding official youth activities (children's corners, Pages' Academy, Youth Combat of any kind, etc.) will require TWO people with background checks on file. She noted that a background check is now required as part of getting a Youth-related warrant. We are grandfathered in (i.e. all set) for Battle of the Oranges. Questions about the background checks can be directed to Kisaiya, the Kingdom Chancellor of Youth Activities. Solvarr said that a friend of his was intending to run a gaming booth at which kids might end up show up without their parents to play, and asked if a background check would be necessary to run such a booth. Nikulai recommended that anyone working with kids on a regular basis get one just to be on the safe side and that a second adult should always be present. Solvarr noted that a background check provides no protection to the person being checked. Mariana stated that the requirement only applies to youth-related activities that are officially sponsored by an SCA group. Adriana recommended that if an unsupervised child is found, a herald should halt the highest profile activity, preferably the fighting, walk the kid to the middle of it and announce that that activity will cease until the parents are found.

Seneschal: Present, running the meeting and, distracted with scribbling the minutes, forgets to deliver her report! Tsk.

Canton Reports:

Atillium: Not present.

Buckston: Ursula read the following report from Philippa: Buckston is **back at St. Philip's!** The church renovation was wonderful, we have keys, and there are showers so all is good! Heavy and rapier practice will happen prior to each Tuesday's meeting starting at 5:30 PM. Doors to the church will often be open around 5:30 PM, and definitely open by 7:00pm with the meeting at 7:30. Directions are on the Buckston and Windmasters web sites. **A Ball in Honor of St Vitus** is happening on Saturday, April 19th from 10am to 10 PM. This is a GREAT event for newcomers. We will teach all the favorite dances of the SCA plus challenge our experienced dancers with new skills. There will be many teachers so come and play. If you don't dance (broken leg, knee surgery or 2 left feet) there will be games to play all day. A feast and a Baronial Court with Her Excellency Rosalind Delamere are also part of the fun. **Baronial Work Day:** Saturday, March 22. Come and help! Bring a side dish, appetizer or dessert for the pot luck plus what you want to drink during the day. If you have not volunteered for a specific job, just show up (but you may want to wear crappy clothes). See the Baronial web page for directions.

[Nikulai noted that he had bought signs that lasted several years, and remarked that we might want to save the time and effort and consider buying signs instead of making them.] Philippa will present an event bid at the April meeting for a Kingdom sewing competition called the "**Golden Needle**" for Fri-Sat, October 17-18, 2008 to be hosted by Windmasters' Hill in cooperation with the St. Anne's Guild of Clothiers. The event budget is anticipated to be about \$1,500. Ursula noted that **Buckston's HEAVY fighter practice for Tues, March 25th only** would be at her house to allow the new fighters access to Valdemar's workshop to get their armour ready for authorizations at Battle of the Oranges that week. (Rapier practice on the 25th will be at St. Phillip's Church as usual.) Nikulai remarked that as MoL, it was good to have the heads-up on expected authorizations.

Elvegast: Manus reported that the upcoming **NCSU demo** was canceled due to communications confusion with NCSU Grounds Dept, and that the demo will be rescheduled with more advance notice. Elvegast's annual **demo at the Raleigh Renfaire**, will be on the last of the three weekends of the Faire, April 12 and 13, in the same spot as last year (on the grass by the jousting field). This year's coordinator is Orla (mka Jackie), who can be reached at orla.elvegast@gmail.com or (919) 802-3882 from 10AM – AM. Douglas is our liaison to the faire management. He noted that the staff entrance has changed and that we will have 20 passes for demo staff that will not be date specific (and will therefore be useable all weekend). People not working the demo can contact him for half price faire tickets. More information will be posted on The Keep. Douglas reported the final numbers for **Ymir**: 586 trolled in, 125 Non-Member Surcharges, with total collections of \$9,886, total expenses of \$5,587 and a profit of \$4299. Per "The Ymir Compact," the initial contribution from each of the five Cantons was returned plus %20 of the event profits. Elvegast voted to donate their 40% of profits (\$1719) to the Barony. Elvegast has distributed checks to the Barony, Buckston, and Kappellenberg, and will mail checks to Attilium and Nimenefeld, since no representatives were present.

Kappellenberg: Seneschal not present. Nikulai reported that Duncan was the reservationist for the Battle of the Oranges on the 29th, and that the fantastic menu by Lady Guenièvre has been posted in several places. Nikulai is the MoL. The event will run from 10 AM–10 PM, and help will be needed with teardown so that we can be off the site on time. A crew will be transporting the dirty dishes for a dishwashing party at Giovann and Challe's place, and help will be much appreciated. Nikulai noted that Kappellenberg's Monday meetings before and after the event would be devoted to pre-planning and the post-mortem. After that, their regular A&S classes will resume with the 2nd part of a persona class where people are encouraged to come in garb and tell their persona's story. Nikulai talked about some of the cool classes and Ursula noted that Kappellenberg's full class schedule is posted on their website. Fighter practices are still on Thursday nights at Wilson Park in Carrboro. Rapier begins at 5:30 PM and heavy practices have returned from a lengthy hiatus, presumably tonight. Wistric is the Rapier Marshal and Artus is the Heavy Marshal.

Nimenefeld: Not present. Ursula reported that Nimenefeld's Wednesday night fighter practices will resume in April, and that they're asking for marshals to volunteer to cover the practices.

Baronial Event: Pas du Forêt Mystérieux on 13-15 June at Farm Ventures in Leasburg, NC: Lyneya (the autocrat) distributed copies of the bid for the event, which is based on a Burgundian Pas held in Barcelona in 1455. Rapier and heavy tournaments are planned with a grand mêlée to follow each. A team called "The Defenders of the Mysterious Forest" will be selected by invitation prior to the event and challengers will be the remainder of the fighters present who wish to participate. All entrants must present themselves on the field in order to participate. There will be four prizes each for heavy and rapier: Chivalry, chosen by the ladies in attendance; Prowess (not necessarily the tourney winner), chosen by the fighters themselves; Countenance (appearance, armour, style, etc.), chosen by the Peers; and Magnificence ("wow" factor), chosen by the populace. A Torchlight Ball will be held on Friday evening (dress to impress, as the ladies will be selecting their Champions at the Ball) as well as an astrological walk for the balmy summer evening, weather permitting. Finally, there will be a Bardic on Saturday night. The projected expenses are \$2030, which includes \$120 for the refundable site and key deposits. The budget assumes 130 adults attending with 80 onboard for feast. Adult site fee is \$13, which includes camping fee. Feast is \$7. Projected profit is \$100. Ursula called for a vote to accept the bid. Trepina noted that we've already paid the \$800 deposit and that we have 30 days before the event to cancel and receive a full refund. Fifteen showed their membership cards in favour. One opposed because it's tradition. The bid was officially accepted.

New Business: Her Excellency asked for a show of hands as to how many people read The Windlore and how many read Their Excellencies' letter in the Windlore. Ursula thanked everyone and closed the meeting at 9pm.

All will be followed by a sumptuous feast in the evening. Additionally, we invite those of artistic inclinations to share their work and join us for various activities, including an Artisan's Row.

A briefe discourse of the voyage and entrance of the Queene of Spaine into Italy: With the Triumphes and pomps shewed aswell in the Cittyes of Ostia, Ferrara, Mantua, Cremona, Milane, as in other boroughes and townes of Italy. Also the report of the voyage of the Archduke Albert into Almaine.

It is presumed to be published in London in 1599.

I couldn't find everything I wanted on one page but there were 3 pages that interested me and they appeared to be written by the same hand. Pages 10, 11 & 16 not only had letters I wanted embedded in text but entire words that would be relevant ex: "king, queen" etc.

Greetings!

I want to announce that we have a new checking account with Wachovia bank. I have obtained the local and regional signatures and I will be sending everything to the Kingdom Exchequer for her signature. Then we can start working to close our account with BB&T during the second quarter.

We received a \$500 donation from GlaxoSmithKline on behalf of volunteer work of Nikulai. He has requested that the funds be allocated for "Pennsic Encampment Funds." The Barony also received a check from Elvegast for \$1,719.44 from Ymir profits.

At the March Baronial meeting the Barony voted to allocate \$2,238 for an event called "Le Pas du forêt mystérieux" (The Pas of the Mysterious Forest) to be held June 13-15 at the Farm Ventures site. Lyneya Allein is the event steward and Maddalena Salutati is the deputy event steward. The Barony has already paid \$870 of that allocation for the site fee and deposits for the event.

Currently the Barony has \$13,659.37, of which \$2,418 is allocated and \$11,241.37 is unallocated. The allocated funds are: \$50 Baronage Discretionary Fund, \$500 Baronial Emergency Fund, \$500 Pennsic Encampment Fund, and \$1,368 for the Pas event.

The Barony is doing well and I fully expect that the financial probation will be lifted at the end of March.
