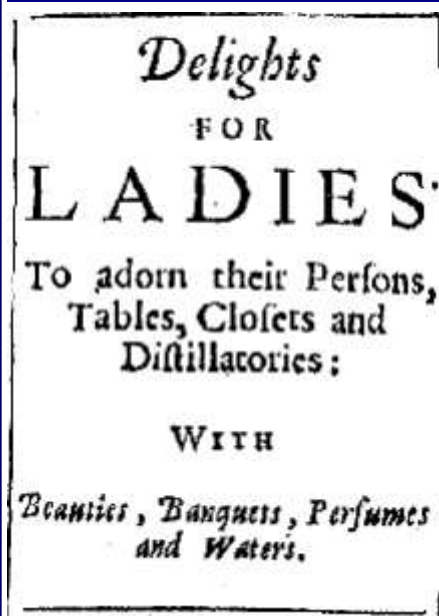

## Book Review: Delights for Ladies

Delights for Ladies to adorn their Persons, Tables, Closets and Distillatories with Beauties, Banquets, Perfumes and Waters.

Written by Sir Hugh Plat and first published in 1602.

This is a book of household management and recipes—food, spirits, cosmetics and others.

While published just slightly out of period, it is a good resource for those looking at late 16th century England.

You can find facsimiles of this book on through Early English Books Online (which can be accessed through most libraries—please make friends with your local librarians!).

The book is divided into four sections:

- ◇ Secrets in Disstillation

## Game Instructions – Fox & Geese

Fox & Geese developed in Medieval Europe, and was well known by the mid-15<sup>th</sup> Century. It was widely played in Medieval Europe, and more recently.

Fox & Geese belongs to a large worldwide family of unequal “hunt” games: games in this family are also found in Southern Asia and the Far East. There are a number of variations in the game as played in Europe and North America. Before 1600 the game was usually played with thirteen geese who could move diagonally: after 1600 it was usually played with seventeen geese who could not move diagonally, i.e. orthogonally only. By the mid-19<sup>th</sup> Century the game was played with as many as 22 geese; it is said to have been a favorite pastime of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert. Some Fox & Geese boards, principally in France but also occasionally in England, have four additional spaces in the crook of the arms of the cross.

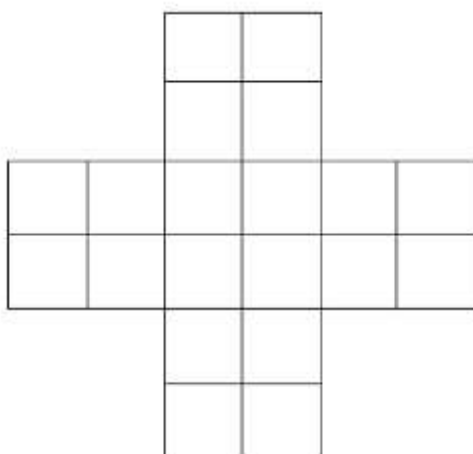
One player controls a “flock” of geese. The Geese move by one space per turn, and do not capture: they try to immobilize the Fox by “swarming” him so that he cannot move. The other player controls a single fox, who attempts to capture as many of the geese as he can. The fox moves by one space in any direction when he moves, and by two spaces when he captures. Capture is made as in Checkers, by jumping over an adjacent counter to an empty space just beyond. Multiple jumps as in Checkers/Draughts are allowed. Jumping is compulsory: this allows the “geese” player to set traps for the fox, sacrificing an occasional piece as “bait”.

Movement rules for the Geese vary in different versions of the game, as do victory conditions for either player. I suggest that you play Fox & Geese with the geese moving forward or sideways, but not diagonally nor backward: the fox winning if he captures eight or more geese. Different version vary on who wins if the geese get all the way across the board without trapping the fox. Some say that they have won a limited victory, as they have escaped across the field without losing eight geese: others say that the geese have lost, as they have failed to trap the fox. It is good for the two players to decide on this before commencing play.

Boards for this game vary quite a bit: not only is there the French variation with four additional spaces in the crook of each arm, but some versions have longer “arms”. Some lines between spaces may be marked, or the board may just be a matrix of dots.

Fox & Geese has inspired a number of other games, including “Solitaire”, a capturing game for one player, as well as “Asalto” (also known as “Officers & Sepoys” or “Siege”).

A game board may be made of wood, leather, embroidered onto a piece of cloth, or even carved/scratched into a table, chest-lid, or bench. Counters should be differentiated by color and/or shape, and can be cribbage counters (if the board is drilled with holes to accept them), buttons, beads, pebbles, seashells, coins, or lumps of glass.

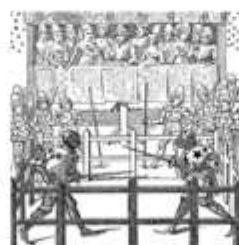
